There are two clear halves that reflect the structure of the choreography and the narrative and TWO CLIMAXES that correlate to the end of both FLOW ONE & FLOW TWO.

The accompaniment helps to communicate the dark and sombre atmosphere and adds tension but is also delicate to reflect the fragile relationship. The score uses strings that are very emotive, as well as piano, which gives a fragile and tentative quality.
