

I would like to thank you all for your ongoing support as I complete 3 years at All Saints Academy. It continues to be a roller-coaster of emotions but the upward trajectory is plain to see in the graph below.

When I arrived in November 2015 the Academy was well-below average and in the bottom 10% of secondary schools nationally. In 2016 we moved upwards to a below average school into the bottom 20% of schools. This summer we moved into an average or middle 40% of schools nationally and staff are now aiming to make All Saints Academy an above average school as soon as possible.

There is so much to be proud of here at All Saints Academy. We have high standards and aspirational expectations for all of our students and I am delighted that 87% of you would recommend us to other parents. We will work hard to unpick the other 13% and why you perhaps feel All Saints Academy is not commendable — but we will not lower our high expectations of behaviour and standards.



Staying Hydrated Through the Day
