#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

Our validated results are finally through and I am pleased to confirm that we are indeed an 'Average' Academy, whatever average might mean!

This means that we have moved from well-below average, to below average and now to average over the course of the last three years. In terms of numbers of schools, it means we have gone from the bottom 10% of secondary schools nationally to the middle 40% of schools and we won't stop there!

What can you help us with? Attendance!

We still struggle with some of our students getting in to school and realising the importance of an attendance over 96%. Today (Friday 1st February), we stayed open when many other schools have closed because of the snow. Students have sat in front of me today still learning valuable content! It is vital that we support our students and ensure that missing school becomes an exception rather than the norm!

As we approach half-term the weather has taken a turn for the worse, so please remind your children to travel to and from school carefully, as we look forward to a milder half-term. With best wishes

#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

It's rather too late to wish you a Happy New Year, but the sentiments are there, even if they are a month old by now! I'm not one for making resolutions, although I am shamed by friends who have been observing 'Dry January', which is very commendable. What I do know is that All Saints starts 2019 in a good place. You might be aware that the government produced its finalised secondary school data and league tables recently. They confirmed that our Progress 8 score is -0.13, making us an Average school - the middle 40% of schools nationally. It also confirmed that our 6th Form provision is Average. Putting that into context, we are 7th out of 13 schools in Central Bedfordshire in terms of GCSE outcomes, and 6th out of 12 schools in Central Beds for A Level performance. What is also significant is that All Saints is the highest performing secondary school, with an intake at Year 7, in Dunstable (Priory Academy does better but is a 9-16 school, admitting into Year 5). It's not a competition, because all young people deserve the best education, but we have outperformed Houghton Regis Academy, Queensbury and Manshead!

Of course, you can prove most things you want with data ('Lies, damned lies and statistics') but there is no doubt that the effort which has been made over the past three years or so is reaping benefits. This term is a crucial one for all students, but particularly our Year 11 and Year 13 cohorts. This is their last full term of learning before entering the summer-term examination period. It is vital that everyone does their utmost to secure the outcomes that are clearly possible and which they deserve.

In closing, I ask for your support, as parents and carers, to ensure that your children, whatever year they are in, attend school on a regular basis and come prepared to learn, both physically and emotionally. We are proud of every single one of our students and want the very best for each one.

#### Year 8 Parents Evening

As you read this newsletter, we are preparing for our Year 8 Parents/Carers' Evening on 6th February. This is an important evening for our Year 8 students as it provides an opportunity to review progress in all subjects before making the all important choices for GCSE courses.

After half term, we will welcome Year 8 students and their families back to the Academy for a Pathways Evening on Thursday 21st February. This evening will provide an opportunity to view the courses on offer, discuss appropriate pathways with staff and gain a valuable insight into the choices process.

#### **Mathematics Workshops**

The Mathematics team have been hosting a series of workshops for Year 11 students, first of a kind at All Saints Academy! The aim of the sessions was to develop methods for empowering parents to support their children in preparation for the upcoming GSCE examinations and moreover, reflect upon uses of mathematics in everyday life, so they can support their children's mathematics learning. Every day we experience our Maths learning through problem solving, which enables us to apply our Maths knowledge and understanding to real life situations. We have had a real focus on Mathematical thinking and reasoning, using models, images and functional exam questions to help us. The Maths workshops have been a great success, thank you to all those who attended. We received such positive feedback which was lovely to hear. We wish all our Year 11 students the best of luck for the upcoming exams.

#### 'Project 5' Maths and English Workshops

As mentioned elsewhere, we have invested heavily in a wide range of interventions, including a programme called 'Project 5'. Many students find pushing into the secure Grade 5 boundary for English and/or Maths really challenging, so we have ensured that we have a rolling programme of support that targets exactly this very important and significant group of students.

So far, 60 Year 11 students have accessed this provision and we have one more round of 'Project 5' forthcoming in April which will see an additional 30 students gain access to this very valuable intervention prior to the summer exams.

#### Period 6

Period 6 intervention sessions are continuing throughout the year, with many students accessing this additional and focused support. Students are welcome to attend any Period 6 session and many have been targeted with personalised timetables that were posted home prior to the Christmas break.

# Graham Elsdon – Additional Targeted English Support.

Our Key Stage 4 students in both Year 10 and Year 11 have been lucky enough to work with Graham Elsdon, a lead examiner for AQA, once a month in some very targeted English Language and Literature Workshops.

Graham is an outstanding and widely respected practitioner who has delivered extremely beneficial sessions to our students that are full of helpful tips, advice on what an examiner is looking for and a general insight into how to achieve highly in English assessments. These monthly workshops will continue throughout both this and the coming term and we look forward to seeing the impact of Graham's work with our students.

#### Saturday HA Maths

15 students have been working with our partners from twenty:twenty learning and have taken full advantage of a targeted set of Saturday morning workshops to increase their academic outcomes in Maths.

This provision is proving to be a valuable use of time and will continue, with the next Saturday workshop scheduled for 23rd February and the final one on 27th April.

#### **Maths Workshops**

We have invested heavily in additional support and intervention that targets Maths progress at Year 11. So far a total of 76 Year 11 students have worked through an intensive 25 hour Maths workshop that is led by a group of experienced external guest speakers. Assessment outcomes for Year 11s in Maths is starting to show us the positive impact of this hard work and dedication and we would like to take this opportunity to praise all of the students who have worked through such an intensive and demanding week. Your dedication and effort will pay off if you continue to focus in class and make appropriate efforts when studying independently.

We have also had a programme of parent and student Maths workshops running every Wednesday evening for the past month. These have been led by our Maths teachers and have proven to be a well received additional intervention. It has been wonderful to see families working together with the support of our staff. All attendees have been welcome to stay for an evening meal after every session. This provision will restart again later in the year as we approach the summer exams.
