I hope you have all had a wonderful half-term with your families. We now enter into the run-up to Christmas with so much going on in the Academy. At the beginning of November our Year 11, 12 and 13 students start their mock exams. I have to say that the Year 11 students are an amazingly hard-working year group who are keen to revise and improve upon the grades they achieved at the end of the summer term. I know as parents and carers you will understand how important this year is for them and will support them with ensuring they have quality time and a conducive space to study.

Thank you for the support you are giving to the Academy in reminding your children to always be polite and courteous to the staff at All Saints. It is now very rare for a student to be rude to a teacher or refuse to comply with our expectations. We do not tolerate students who refuse to do as they are asked and refusal will end up with a fixed-term exclusion being issued, though I would like to reassure you that a lot of time goes into persuading the students to make the right choice.

Behaviour standards start with sticking to the uniform code and the vast majority of students look extremely smart every morning. We will send a text home if there is an issue with uniform and if it is not corrected by the following day you will be contacted to say we are sending your child home to rectify it. Please can I ask for your help with two particular issues? Piercings and nails! We allow one pair of studs only and absolutely no facial piercings. Nails should be of a neutral colour and not false nails which tend to be unreasonably long. Bear in mind that students come to the Academy to learn and need to be able to write. Dear Parents and Carers

We have reached that point in the year where the nation pauses, among all the political turmoil, to remember all of those who died in the service of their country, primarily in the two World Wars. As usual, the students and staff at the Academy will pause for reflection at 1100 on 8th November and probably be reminded of a few of the many poignant words that are spoken at this time of year: 'For Your Tomorrow, We Gave Our Today'. The occasion is always characterised by solemnity and dignity by everyone involved.

Many of those people who died in conflict, especially those who served in the First World War, were no older than our students. I hope there will never be a time again when our young people are forced to take up arms against an enemy. Sadly, however, there is still conflict within some of the communities in which we live, graphically illustrated in Milton Keynes recently when two 17year-old boys were stabbed to death.

Apart from educating our students about the values that are expected of a civilised society, we have a duty to keep them all safe. If anyone threatens that safety by acts of behaviour that we consider to be anti-social or downright dangerous, we will not hesitate to remove that threat by the sanctions available to us. The governors are adamant that we will have a policy of zero tolerance towards anyone who puts the safety and well-being of fellow students and staff at risk. Once again, I am grateful to the vast majority of students and parents who support our behaviour policy and contribute so positively to the life of the Academy.

Understanding teenagers

The average teenager's body is changing at an alarming rate, as hormones shift and surge, the body, brain and emotions are on a permanent rollercoaster.

The extremes of emotion that teens go through are also partly due to hormones. Boys are coming to terms with large quantities of testosterone surging through their bodies while girls have to cope with the mood swings that accompany oestrogen. It is an exciting time for teenagers, but also a very scary and challenging one. A time when the support and encouragement of parents is essential to their successful transition into adulthood.

Tips for coping

Stay positive - things can change. Don't assume the worst or your teenager will too. Look for signs of change and notice when things go well, even for a short time. Try to be a positive voice in their lives – it affirms that they can have a positive future even if things are difficult now.

Like who they are - try to separate the behaviour from the person. Remember all their good qualities and try not to be overpowered by what you don't like about their behaviour right now. Your teenager may be behaving badly but that doesn't make them a bad person.

Be there - contrary to how it may seem at times, your teenagers do want to talk to you. But you need to let it be in their time and at their pace. Listen to their ideas, don't interrupt or try to tell them what to do.

Be reassuring - a lot of teenagers are scared by the feelings they're experiencing and the new wave of responsibilities that they have to take on. They need lots of reassurance that they're not going mad and they will cope.
