INDIVIDUALISED PATHWAYS

What is self-esteem and self-worth?

We all begin life with a simple view of the world. As young children we trust easily and freely, we are full of adventure and life is full of possibilities. As we grow up, we learn to listen to what others think of us and what society tells us we should be like. As we grow up we look to the people closest to us to confirm or reject these ideas of ourselves. This all goes a long way to shaping our self-worth.

When you are positive with your children, encouraging them to feel good about themselves, you are building the foundations for a person who will be resilient later in life. They'll be better able to cope with life's ups and downs, trust their own judgement, see their potential and be more confident.

Building self-worth in your teenagers

Encourage your young person to develop a sense of who they are. Find out what they believe in. What are their values in life? What qualities do they think are important and why? What does it mean to be trustworthy, honest, loyal, and courageous or compassionate, for example?

Most teenagers welcome a bit of healthy debate – they may hold very different views from yours but encourage them to think things through for themselves. Difference is ok; understanding that we can have different views to others can help them build necessary skills in accessing situations, making judgements and being tolerant.

Having healthy relationships is also an important part of your self-worth, so talk to your children about their friendships, relationships with teachers and family friends. What kind of qualities do they look for in a friend? What kind of friend are they? What is difficult and what works to resolve difficulties? Feelings can be powerful and overwhelming for many young people particularly in adolescence, but talk about how they can express their feelings appropriately and safely.



Reading ages will be retested after the Christmas break and the programme will be adjusted when we have the results.

The English Curriculum Area is running the 500 Word writing challenge this term. All details are on the Year 7 (C2PCL) and Year 8 (LPNCW) Showbie noticeboards and there is an opportunity to work on this writing at lunchtime with staff in the English department.

Assessment Point One

Assessment point one (AP1) has now been completed and Flight Plans will be sent home with students. There will be set changes in the majority of subjects as a result of these assessments.

Pencil Cases

Our recent equipment checks show that some students are coming into the Academy without charging their iPad ready for the day ahead. Please make this part of their daily routine as students use these valuable learning resources in the majority of lessons. A few students need to replace equipment in the pencil cases which we provided free of charge at the start of the year. There will be a charge of £1.00 which represents excellent value for the pencil case and students can purchase their replacements at Student Reception at any break or lunchtime.

Attendance Rewards

Every week, we award a bag of Celebrations to every form group who achieve over 95% attendance. We are delighted that we have had to issue **30** bags of chocolates since half term. Well done to every form group who has attended well and regularly. We currently have **90** students with 100% attendance and **113** students with 95%+ attendance.

Students with 100% attendance will receive a £25 gift voucher and those with 95%+ will receive a £10 gift voucher.

New Period 6 Personalised Timetables – January 2020.

We have used the Year 11 students AP1 data to analyse exactly who would benefit from this additional support provision as we now enter a really crucial phase in the year. New timetables will be sent out in the new year and all Period 6 sessions have recommenced since the November mock exams have finished. As has always been the case, all Period 6 sessions have an open-door policy, meaning any student is welcome to attend. Pinpoint Learning – GCSE Maths Tool investment

I am thrilled to announce that All Saints has made a significant investment in an outstanding online resource that analyses GCSE Maths outcomes and provides fantastic personalised and easily accessible resources for each and every student. The tool is called 'Pinpoint Learning' and our GCSE Maths students, starting with our current Year 11 cohort, will each be given an induction into using the system imminently. Essentially this tool allows staff to input real exam results, which are then in turn converted into targeted resources, such as printable work booklets and other online resources that focus on the student's particular areas that require improvement. Students will all receive login details soon.

Sixth Form 2020

We have started our application process for Sixth Form 2020. Remembering in the Community


