







The national careers service website:
This is a government website. It is easy to use and has lots of basic information about different job sectors broken down into the many jobs that sector includes. It is a good way to research the jobs in the sector you are interested in, for example, in construction and trades there are 79 different jobs to look at! This way it can give you new ideas of jobs you might like, what they involve and how you can access them, through college, university, apprenticeships or working.

South East Midlands Local Enterprise Partnership (SEMLEP) careers explorer:
This website gives you lots of up to date information for our region (south east midlands) and nationally. The data is shown in lots of graphs and is easy to look at. It gives lots of extra information about statistics of the jobs. You can download the information easily in a PDF format. It shows vacancies and apprenticeships in the area radius you set. This links directly to the government apprenticeship website when you apply for apprenticeships.

PROSPECTS:
Job Profiles on the PROSPECTS website gives you lots of information about jobs and includes information on employers, work experience, professional development and careers development that may help you work out if that job would suit you. There is lots of detail and it is more 'wordy' but has lots of helpful information on jobs and companies and related jobs that might interest you!


What is the local employment market like in our area?
