# What you should already

### know

Caribbean music, film music, samba music, jazz and blues, keyboard and ukulele skills.

#### Information

Term 1 – Protest songs

This term you will protest songs – in particular the messages and themes behind the lyrics. You will compose lyrics for your own protest song, as well as a backing track to go with it.

Term 2 - Composing to a brief

This term, you will get a number of briefs to respond and compose music. Your brief may ask you to compose music for a comedy soundtrack and for a science-fiction film. You will learn about a range of composition techniques, such as hook/riff, rhythmic pattern, melodies, chords, stepwise movement, conjunct and disjunct melodies, as well as repetition and sequence. You can use music technology and instruments for these.

Term 3 - Final Project

This term you will either choose a performance or composition pathway. If you choose performance, you will select which instrument (or voice) on which you wish to perform. You will select a song, rehearse, and perform it. If you choose the composition pathway, you will create a free choice composition. You will be able to use instruments to compose, or music technology, or a combination of both combined.

Unit 2 – Managing a Music Product – Here you will put on a concert

Unit 4 – Introducing Music Composition – Here you will compose music

You will get a template if needed for your protest song. You can use rhyming dictionary if you want, though you do not have to make your song rhyme.

You can use the iMac, Garageband, Logic Pro and the MIDI keyboard to help you compose or stick to instruments.

Here you will choose a song to perform – there will be free choice but if you need help, there will be songs available for you to choose from if needed.

There will be chord sheets to help you if you are choosing the composition pathway.
