Dear Parents and Carers

This is the final newsletter of what has been a relatively normal year. Whilst COVID has still affected many students, staff and families, we have not faced the disruption of the previous two academic years, with public examinations taking place for the first time since 2019. I want to praise all those students who have worked so hard and overcome the recent challenges; I firmly believe they will be appropriately rewarded when the results come out in late August.My thanks to all parents and carers who have supported their child(ren) during this academic year - the 3-way relationship between student, school and home remains vital.

These past few weeks have been somewhat tumultuous in a political sense and will remain so, I suspect, until well into the start of the next academic year. I note that, since the Academy officially opened in 2009, there have been nine Secretaries of State for Education! None of them has been in post long enough to see through a whole cohort of students, even from Year to 7 to Year 11, let alone into Years 12 and 13. You will recall the shortest serving one was just a couple of days! By contrast, during that same time period, the Academy has had just two Principals: Tom Waterworth and Liz Furber. Both happen to have seen through a full cohort of students, which in itself is quite unusual in today's education world. My colleague governors and I are deeply grateful for the commitment and dedication shown by them, especially by Liz Furber in the exceptional period we have recently experienced. What I also want to acknowledge is the on-going support of our local MP, Andrew Selous, who is a tremendous advocate for All Saints and all we are trying to achieve.

We have heard a lot recently about loyalty, one of the core values that we seek to instil and embrace. I am deeply grateful to all the staff who have remained loyal to the Academy throughout its journey. I am also grateful to all those parents and carers who entrust the education of their child(ren) to us; your on-going loyalty is much appreciated. For those students and their families whose time with us has come to a natural end (either leaving Year 11 or Year 13), I wish you all the very best for the future. For those leaving part way through the normal cycle to seek pastures new, I hope you will find the educational experience you are seeking. Embracing new ventures can be full of both excitement and uncertainty and, unlike politicians who seem to chop and change positions at the drop of a hat, our students cannot backtrack on their journey through compulsory education. As an Academy, we remain committed to supporting them on that journey in whatever way we can.

In closing, can I wish you and your family a restful and relaxing summer holiday. As I have written previously, these are extremely challenging times, but I hope you get the opportunity to experience things that are not part of the daily norm during the next few weeks.
