We know that the COVID pandemic has had a significant impact on behaviour in schools across the country, but at All Saints we are pleased to report that all behaviour measures have improved over the course of the year. Figures show that behaviour is rapidly improving within the Academy. We are



pleased to inform you that there have been less suspensions this year when compared to last year, average weekly behaviour points have decreased through the year and isolation figures are significantly lower compared to the first two terms. These measures show that behaviour is rapidly improving as the impact of the pandemic lessens.
