## Punctuality to School

Getting to school on time every day is very important. If students are late to school they miss registration, morning assembly and, depending on how late they are, the start of the first lesson. This is an important time for any student as it allows them to make sure they are prepared for the day and receive the important messages from assembly. Also, punctuality is an important life skill as employers want workers that arrive to work on time. Please encourage your child to arrive to school on time, by 8.25am. If they arrive after 9.30am they will receive a 'U' attendance code



which counts as an absence for the morning. Please encourage your child to arrive at school for a prompt start to their day and avoid after school detentions.

## Attendance

As the term starts to settle down, it is vital that there is good attendance standards in the Academy. With so much time missed due to the pandemic, it is vital that no further days are missed unnecessarily. If your child wakes up and feels unwell, please give them some medicine and see if they are well enough to come into school a little later. There are termly rewards that are linked to attendance, so please encourage good attendance so that they qualify for these rewards.

## School Parliament

Members of the School Parliament have already made a significant contribution to the running of the school. They have painted the bathrooms so that they look fresh and are running a competition to design posters to display in these areas with issues that are relevant to people in their age group.



## Uniform

There has been significant improvements in uniform standards and students are looking much smarter than they ever have.
