

"Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the celebration. John 2:2

Many of the articles I write come from a general perspective that things are not as good as they might be, for whatever reason, and that we can tap into God to enable us to help us overcome a problem or

situation. It would, however, be very wrong to assume that Christianity is only about overcoming problems and difficulties. We read of numerous places in the Bible that God is generous and personal and has an abundance of gifts and good things for people to enjoy!



Therefore, what better way to remind ourselves what God feels about good times and celebrations than to recall the passage where Jesus and his disciples were invited to a wedding celebration.

Admittedly, Christianity can sometimes be portrayed as being dull, boring, uninteresting, uninspiring and grey. In actual fact, it should be the very opposite - Jesus himself was none of those things. And here He is, with His friends, and a problem occurs because the host has run of wine. For a wedding celebration in the 1st Century Middle East, this was both embarrassing and a disaster, for weddings were very much a whole community occasion which lasted for many days. And we might think that Jesus, being a good Jew, would think something along the lines of; well there you go, you have had plenty to drink already, let us just go home and get on with our lives.

But, no! Here is Jesus performing His first recorded miracle when He turns the water into wine! He does not tell people to stop celebrating but actually provides what is required to keep it going! Just to be clear, Jesus is not



advocating getting completely drunk here - there are plenty of other occasions where Jesus talks about personal responsibility and the dangers that occur when people drink too much. But Jesus is certainly very supportive of having a good time! At the time of writing, many of us are hoping that Luton Town FC will be celebrating a Wembley win in the play-offs and promotion to the Premier League.

So when we might have something to celebrate, do not exclude God from being part of those celebrations. Through Jesus, He has proved that He likes a good party! Maybe that might be something worth reflecting on.
