'I just want to express how disappointed I am for you and your staff upon reading this damning Ofsted report. I would like to say that I have noticed really good improvements this past academic year, particularly in Year 11. I feel that All Saints has come a long way since 2018 and you should be proud. It is an ongoing, endless battle and I am rooting so much that you and your fantastic staff win.'

'I just wanted to feedback that I don't recognise the school in the report!!!! My daughters have said that the report is not a reflection of the school at all. Keep up the amazing work and hopefully the school will get the recognition it deserves.'

'I would like to share that this has not been our experience for our daughter who loves attending All Saints and thinks highly of the teaching staff. I personally would like to thank you for all your hard work and to say that it does not go unnoticed.'

Dear Parents and Carers

This is the final newsletter of what has been a challenging year for the Academy. I have been reflecting on various types of communication we use in our lives, and this form of direct, written communication is one that I prefer.

Perhaps it is a generational thing, but I do not care for social media because it can lead to misinformation and misunderstanding. There are some people who believe absolutely everything they read on social media, and some people who seemingly believe everything they write on social media, even if they don't have the factual base to back up what they write. I was reading recently that one person, who thought they could make false accusations (about the suspended BBC presenter) had agreed to pay £1000 to charity rather than the possibility of tens of thousands for defaming someone who was totally innocent. It turns out that people can be held accountable for what they put out on social media, even if they believe otherwise.

Let me therefore give you some information that I heard first-hand, together with four other colleagues, on 23 November 2022. This was the date on which four Ofsted inspectors delivered their feedback after a full, two-day inspection. The headlines were that their provisional judgements deemed Leadership Management, Personal Development, Quality of Education and Sixth Form to be Good. Behaviour & Attitudes was deemed to be Requires Improvement, along with the overall grade, and Safeguarding was effective. Those are indisputable facts.

The team that spent half a day in January came to conclusions that are published in the final report. The governors of the Academy, who visit the school on a regular basis, do not recognise the place described in that report. That is why we are pursuing legal action against Ofsted in the High Court.

Governors also recently expressed total confidence in

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the staff at the Academy and are grateful for direct messages of support that have been received from parents/carers to that effect.

As we embark on the summer holiday period, can I wish you and your family an enjoyable and restful time. I will certainly undertake to communicate to you any relevant updates at appropriate times in the coming months. Best wishes


Work Experience

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Water Safety Letter from Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Service

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope this letter finds you well. Over the last few years, Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Service, Bedfordshire Police and the Local Authorities have been contacted by residents across Bedfordshire raising concerns for young people swimming and jumping into outdoor water sites including:

Priory Marina – Bedford Wixams Lakes – Wixams Kempston Mill - Kempston

River Ivel - Shefford Blue Lagoon – Arlesey Stewartby Lake – Forest of Marston Vale

Over 400 people accidently drown in the UK and Ireland every year, and many more have non-fatal experiences with some of these being life changing.

We want to alert parents and young people of the potential dangers and risk to life, especially as we are now enjoying the hot weather and sunshine.

Even the strongest of swimmers can get into trouble in water outdoors and we have particular concern for young people who could be putting themselves at risk without knowing the dangers.

Outdoor water can contain many hazards such as entrapments, weeds, rubbish, drains, broken bottles, pollution, under water currents and it can be very hard to judge depth meaning that deep water can suddenly catch someone out but jumping into shallow water could result in serious injury.

Young People may not understand the effects of cold-water shock which can occur when jumping into a river or lake on a hot day. The average water temperatures in the UK are just 12C and anything below 15C is classed as cold water.
